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# Students' Project in Inclusion Education


- Project's aim is to raise awareness of importance of volunteering, stimulate professionals and students to become active in future projects
- Practical application of professional competences with a multidisciplinary work, with elements of community-based work with school and Orphan House
- Demonstrates how the student's project is popularizing Occupational Therapy education and practice in Georgia

# Project goals

- Involve three children in classroom activities
- Involve caregivers and teachers in multidisciplinary team
- Involve occupational therapy and psychology students in assessing children's skills, adapting to the environment and creating an individual learning plan under professional supervision
- Ask students how volunteering provides them new skills, competences and employability
- Institution becomes model for inspiring like-type projects from other YPA members

#### **Responsibilities and Roles**

- Ministry of Education- multi-disciplinary team (
  O.T. psychologist and special teacher)
- •Multi-disciplinary team of students



#### Initial Assessment

- Children weren't participating in classroom activities.
- Three children cannot meet the curriculum's requirements
- Depending on caregivers during school
- Children spending only 2 hours at school

#### Assessment

- Every day children have 3 lessons to improve them cognitive and motor skills but there is no translation of Information about children's skills and abilities from Orphan House to school.
- Teachers did not use the children's strengths to entice them into participating in classroom activities.
- Children's involvement in school was only for socialization and being with peers rather than for the purpose of learning.

#### Recommendations

- Make 3hours of lessons separate 45 min lessons with 15 min of break (school type model):
  - 1. Academic activities (draw figures with shapes, listen to stories, narration, learn alphabet, write lines and learn numbers)
  - 2. Fine motor activities(paint and draw, cut with scissors, play with puzzles, colors, blocks and Lego)
  - 3. Physical activities (games, music, dancing, following instructions)
- Participate with school teachers (homework, sharing information and planning and achieving goals together)
