



HANNEKE VAN BRUGGEN LECTURE

NOMINATION GUIDANCE NOTES

The Hanneke van Bruggen Lecture was created at the 16th Annual ENOTHE 2010 Meeting at Stockholm, Sweden, in honour of Hanneke Van Bruggen then, the outgoing Director of ENOTHE.

In creating the Hanneke van Bruggen Lecture, the ENOTHE board wished to recognise and honour Hanneke Van Bruggen for her unending dedication and outstanding work in promoting occupational therapy in Europe and internationally.

Regulations

The Hanneke van Bruggen Lecture will be held once a year during the ENOTHE Annual Meeting and will be awarded to an Occupational Therapist working in Europe. Other professionals that advocate the Occupational Therapy legacy and values are more than welcome to be invited for this honour. Nominators must be members of ENOTHE.

Procedure

The candidate will have to be nominated by at least two member institutes. (See nomination form for details).

The proposers will write a statement (max. 200-300 words) of support for their nomination and send in detailed Curriculum Vitae of the nominee.

The nominee will have to agree that he/she is willing to be nominated.

The ENOTHE Board will use the following criteria to decide on the Hanneke van Bruggen lecturer:

- Focus on and impact for Occupational Therapy
- The European perspective
- Diversity in local, national or international context
- Span over the triad of education, practice and research
- The relevance to society
- Innovation in occupational therapy education or occupational science

The lecture should address at least some of the above mentioned topics.

The travel expenses and two nights of accommodation will be paid by ENOTHE.

The lecture will be delivered on either of the Annual Meeting days (to be specific later).

Closing date for nominating a speaker for the HVB Lecture is 13th April 2019.

Nominee and nominators will be informed of the outcome by May 20th 2019 at the latest.
