

2019 Hanneke van Bruggen Lecture



Hans Jonsson is currently Professor in Occupational Therapy and Occupational Science at University of Southern Denmark in Odense and Associate Professor at Karolinska Institutet in Stockholm. He graduated as an OT in 1977 and has since 1989 been involved in education and research within occupational therapy and occupational science. He received his PhD in Occupational Therapy in 2000 with a dissertation about the retirement transition as an occupational transition. He has since then been involved in a number of research projects including basic research in elderly and occupation, stroke-research in an Iranian context and within couples adaptation processes, stress-related ill-health and fall-prevention among elderly at risk. He has also published several theoretical articles on the importance of engaging occupations, occupational balance and formulating an occupational perspective. He is a part of the Danish national research group for activity studies and occupational therapy. In tandem with this he is active in education at all levels, introducing Occupational Science for the first semester under-graduate students, leading master courses since 15 years in occupational science and leading Phd-courses in the same discipline. He is active in The European Master Program and is currently chairing the Examination Board of this program.
