At the end of the weekend we went home with appointed tasks related to our board roles. We are very happy to announce that Marta will continue her position as office assistant. She has been a great support in the preparation of and during the AM for the host Silvia Martins and her team as well as the Board and members.

Marlies will be our student board member for a probational year. Under her guidens we have been challenged to discuss roles and responsibilities of the student board member. She will support the board with the design of the Annual Meeting in Greece. Students asked i.e. for more interactive workshops.

Last Annual meeting we had the pleasure to have students and colleagues participating whose University are not a member and their Universities will be actively approached to become a member. In total we talk about 50 potential candidates. We love Big Data[©].

Regarding finances, our treasurer Ursula and office coordinator Mandy work in close collaboration with the Financial Advisory Reference Group (FARG).

As Vice-President Soemitro will be the contact person for the organization of the Meeting in Athens next year and he is now involved in the OT-Europe coordinating group. With the other vice-presidents of COTEC and ROTOS he is member of the register of experts committee.

The Prague Meeting is a common effort by the host Czech Association, Charles University and OT-Europe (COTEC, ENOTHE and ROTOS) representatives. Soemitro and Panagiotis are members of the Scientific Committee and Ursula of the organization committee.

The ENOTHE network, a non-profit organization, would like to be lean and stay break even. However extra income is needed to be fit for future plans. Board as well as members value the output of the project groups highly. Therefore a small increase of membership fees will be proposed in the next annual meeting. Not only members will be asked to use the newsletter to exchange news, the newsletter can also be used for paid advertisement. At this moment a guideline will be written with prices. Also sponsorship can be accepted. Further new guidelines for project groups will be presented soon so that members send in project ideas which will be reviewed and selected for ENOTHE funding. ENOTHE will provide seed funding or start-up money, which can support members to develop a plan to apply for additional grants like Erasmus+ to make their projects sustainable. Lisette will guide this process. Maria would like to take the lead in OT curriculum development in countries in need of Occupational Therapy education. She has experience as many other members. Anybody who would like support or can to offer his/her expertise can contact Maria. She also would like to develop promotional material to attract new members.



Based on members' input, the board is planning to alter the content and organization of the Annual Meeting in a way that during the lectures more interaction can take place. Thus you can submit an abstract and based on the themes, presenters will be appointed to sessions and timeslots. Some keynote lectures might become more interactive as well with a discussion panel. As evaluated, suggested and requested by the members, workshops will be planned related to the General Assembly issues and Strategy plan instead of the pre-General Assembly.

Panagiotis will be our proud host in Greece and we are already busy searching for the beast deal with hotels downtown in Athens. Sustainability Matters, will be the underpinning major theme for the 25th ENOTHE Annual meeting. The themes are based on current issues in Education and on members' wishes during the annual meeting in Portugal.

With support of the office the archives will be digitalized.

Marie-Antoinette is devoted to finalize the official development OT-Europe before her end of term in October 2019. The first meetings with the notary have been planned in the first week of January.

OT - Europe Register of Experts



Call to action for ENOTHE Members!

Register your expertise at the Occupational Therapy Europe Register of Experts

In 2015, COTEC established a Register of Experts in line with the priorities identified by the European targets for 2020 and the WHO key areas for action. COTEC was successful in attracting over 100 people from 16 European National Occupational Therapy Association nominations. Some associations made multiple nominations for an Expert area, others only one, and some associations have made no nominations.

In 2017 it was agreed by ENOTHE, COTEC and recently ROTOS that this register would become the basis of the Register of Experts for Occupational Therapy Europe (OT-EU), expanding the pool of Experts, moving towards representation and visibility across practice, **education** and research.

The purpose of establishing the Register, is to facilitate contact with known Experts in a particular area in order to field the best representation and best available evidence in a timely way, when OT-Europe is asked to respond to a consultation or attend a significant meeting.

Occupational Therapists Practitioners Researchers **and Educators** may now be nominated or nominate themselves to form part of the OT-Europe Register of Experts in any of the following areas:

Mental Health; Ageing Population; Dementia; Children and Adolescents; Poverty Reduction; Primary Care; Equal access to health care systems; ICT solutions and E-Health innovations; Employment; Oncology; Palliative Care; Refugees and displaced people; Neurology; Rehabilitation as well as any other areas in which occupational therapists can make a difference. Being an expert in the register gives you the opportunity to share your knowledge, expand your international network and to strengthen the European Occupational Therapy community.

Please do take the opportunity to acknowledge your expertise on these areas or others and we warmly invite ENOTHE members to spread this news and help OT-Europe to map the widespread expertise and use it to connect and promote OT expertise in the European arena.
