

ENOTHE Webinars

ENOTHE Tuning Updates

The ENOTHE TUNING Task Force has continued its intensive collaborative work in the past months and will join CALOHEx Team, TUNING Academy, in Madrid in 27-29 April. During the Madrid meeting, the taskforce will consider assessment frameworks and revisit the project steps face-to-face. The taskforce will have the unique possibility to discuss the process, challenges and outcomes with teachers in other subject areas, such as Medicine and Business.

In the upcoming months, the project will get feedback from experts, COTEC, WFOT, ROTOS, and the Terminology group, using two rounds of the Delphi method, scheduled before and after the open consultation of the first draft of reference frameworks. Simultaneously, ENOTHE TUNING Task Force will work on the second edition of the reference frameworks.

The involvement of European schools in the open consultation will be crucial for the success. We encourage you to participate in the open consultation. Please stay tuned for updates!

Dear ENOTHE member, Dear student,

We are pleased to announce the 3rd edition of the international ENOTHE Student Summer Course. The topic for this edition is "Community Perspectives on Occupation and Implications for a Sustainable and Digital Society" and the aim is to provide the necessary skills to:

- 1. Describe the role of occupational therapists in community work with diverse groups, considering the multiple challenges and opportunities that the pandemic and the digitalisation of many occupations has brought to societies.
- 2. Explain how the use of occupation can enhance participation of individuals and groups in community.
- 3. Evaluate the influence of local context and policies on occupation for diverse groups and communities.
- 4. Gain a deeper understanding about advocacy and policy, from a community perspective.
- 5. Design community programs by learning about currently innovative projects and community-based assessments.



Students interested in fostering change within communities and adopting a community-based approach to address issues of relevance to occupation, such as occupational injustice and social marginalization through digital transitions are welcome to apply for this course. The course will follow an evidence-based approach, as well as recollect best-practices in the field.

The hosts of this course are the Occupational Therapy Programmes of First Faculty of Medicine in Prague (Charles University), the Health University of Applied Sciences Tyrol (FH Gesundheit) and University School of Nursing and Occupational Therapy of Terrassa (Autonomous University of Barcelona), together in collaboration with ENOTHE and SPOTeurope.

Through lectures with European experts in the field, discussions and practical sessions, our mission is to contribute to the development of occupational therapy competencies, including critical reasoning, teamwork skills, and the ability to create change and incorporate/facilitate efficient collaboration among key stakeholders. This course will facilitate a unique intercultural dialogue and international experience sharing among Occupational Therapy students. Alongside, SPOTeurope will guide unique educational student exchange workshops and leading rich social programmes.


Dear ENOTHE members,

Rural Occupations: Focus of New OTD Program in US

Rural Americans (Estadoundienses) face numerous health care disparities compared to their counterparts in urban, city locations (CDC, 2023). Rural Americans are more likely to die from heart disease, cancer, unintentional injury, chronic lower respiratory disease, and stroke than their urban counterparts (CDC, 2023). Health care in the rural areas of the United States, which makes up about 46 million persons, is often difficult to access and maintain due to lack of service providers committed to the rural American communities. Tarleton State University, located in rural Texas, United States, seeks to answer this need with the creation of health programs in the rural communities served (Tarleton, 2022). As part of a large funding commitment from the Texas State Government, Tarleton State has begun the development of rural focused health care professions, including a Doctor of Occupational Therapy program. Using the "grow your own" model in rural health care medical education, the Tarleton State OTD program will provide a direct focus on rural, underserved health care needs of the local community (American Academy of Family Physicians, 2023). Students will engage in rural community roles, active engagement with local community members and innovative fieldwork experiences within rural locations. Tarleton State OTD students will be fostered into providing care to rural communities not only in Texas, but around the nation through direct instruction, application of skills and integration into rural communities. We are eager to share rural occupation experiences through the eyes of the rural American and gain insight into the occupations of international rural communities. The Government of Catalonia awards the Josep Trueta Medal to Ana Forns, the first occupational therapist and one of the first teachers in Catalonia

University School of Nursing and Occupational Therapy of Terrassa is highly proud of the Governmental recognition of Ana Forns, an emeritus professor and one of the first teachers and co-founder of the programme at our university. The Award was promoted by College of Occupational Therapists of Catalonia.

The Executive Committee of the Government of Catalonia has approved the concession of the Josep Trueta Medals and Plaques for Health Merit this Tuesday, 21 February 2023. Ana Forns, who is considered the first occupational therapist, is among the 15 medals awarded to professionals. This recognition echoes the hearts of Occupational Therapists at the national, European and world levels: a reason for celebration and gratitude for this distinction with which we recognise and honour people who have stood out significantly in the progress and improvement of health.



Anna Forns graduated as an occupational therapist from the Liverpool School of Occupational Therapy in 1952, UK. World Health Organization has awarded her career studies. She is considered the first occupational therapist in Catalonia and one of the first in Spain. She organised the first occupational therapy department in Catalonia with occupational therapy for children with poliomyelitis and a rehabilitation centre in Terrassa.

She created the occupational therapy departments of Vall d'Hebron Barcelona Hospital and the Institute Guttmann and the departments of insurance companies such as Asepeyo and Mútua Catalana. She represented Spain at the World Federation of Occupational Therapists (WFOT). She was a professor at the University School of Nursing and Occupational Therapy of Terrassa and was invited as a key speaker at various international congresses.


