STUDENTS ROLE IN HIGHER EDUCATION

"A partnership goes far beyond the mere consultation, involvement, or representation of students in decision-making processes. Where a partnership exists, students do not only identify areas that could be enhanced, but they help to identify ways in which that enhancement can be carried out, as well as to help facilitate the implementation process wherever possible. Above all, a true partnership means that neither party acts unilaterally but rather that there is an active collaboration between the two. Each party must recognise what the other brings to the table and must value that contribution for the cooperation to work. In this way, a partnership can be seen as opposed to a transactional or consumerist relationship. **Students** actively participate in shaping and co-producing their education, rather than merely receiving it passively. This includes the effort that students put into their learning process in the classroom, but also the work that students are increasingly doing to shape their experience at the course, departmental, institutional and national levels." – European Student Union





STUDENTS ENGAGEMENT

Market model

• Viewing students as customers, positioned external to the institution, they 'acquire' education. The student knows best what kind of improvements are needed.

Development model

• Students are partners in a learning community. They possess not just rights, but also obligations, and actively share their knowledge to foster the advancement of their university.









STUDENT'S PERSPECTIVE

- 13 questions, key findings







Amount and Year of Bsc.








DEGREE COMITTEE











- Not many students generally (how many?), small groups at universities (at my university, 25 students per year)

CONCLUSION + OUR IDEAS

- OT have specific glasses that we think are very nice to wear, we see the world different from everyone else, "OT is a calling "
- How to ensure effective student pariticipation (what would we wish for); more preparation for making change, e.g. in Portugal there aren't many job opportunities for mental health
- 2 students can be motivated to advocate to start more work places in mental health
- ☑ Tools for advocating; laws can be changed! It's only the context that looks different in different countries ☑ we all want to go the same way, work in a very similar way.
- Give students time in their curriculum to network/be involved in projects
- students bring in their perspective on society for the shaping of the future of OT In OT: Specific for every cultural context! OT is very influenced by changes in society (explain why, and note our role in all of this)
- Change by students is more easily done with the support of teachers (e.g. teachers talking of their students ENOTHE, securing financial support for their students to join congresses; role model for change, realistic view on what can be done)
- We are mostly young people; we are all at the beginning of our work life; we are very motivated to change in society (e.g. the problem of not changing the system, but only working with the person) I change is easier with a "partner in crime" (change management)
- **©** Reflect your own programm through the perspective of others (also across boarders); also comparing your own study program with other universities can help in reflecting your own study program
- we need to fight for our rights as OTs, what we are "allowed" to do in work surroundings;
