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THE ECHOES PROJECT – IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ENOTHE

The ECHOES project is a European-funded innovative project that aims to develop a digital platform that seamlessly connects universities with healthcare professionals and educators around the globe. This platform is designed to foster collaboration on educational and research projects, enabling the exchange of healthcare expertise and promoting a culture of collaborative knowledge sharing. The ECHOES project has 12 Associate Partners; Occupational Therapy is represented by ENOTHE and COTEC.

The ECHOES project presents an opportunity for all healthcare educators and professionals, including those in Occupational Therapy, to participate in a network where they can share their expertise and contribute to various educational and research projects. This is important because the distribution of healthcare expertise is uneven across the world, resulting in unequal accessibility to educational opportunities for graduates, which may influence the quality of patient care delivered by these graduates and reduce the research opportunities of many professionals. The ECHOES project's platform will be supported by Artificial Intelligence (AI) to assist universities and other organisations to identify suitable individuals for their projects.

Participation in the ECHOES project facilitates the exchange of expertise and broadening of knowledge, potentially leading to the enhancement of the quality of care offered to patients globally. The project also offers a valuable opportunity for educators and professionals to engage in continuous learning and professional development, ultimately contributing to positive disruptions within the field of healthcare. When the platform is launched in 2025, we shall encourage all occupational therapy educators and professionals to register so they can participate in these exchanges. 


THE BENEFITS OF TEACHERS COMBINING THEIR CLINICAL PRACTICE WITH TEACHING TO TRAIN NEW OCCUPATIONAL THERAPISTS AT SCHOOL OF HEALTH SCIENCES, POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY OF LEIRIA (ESSLEI)

In order to provide good health care, it is essential to develop professionals who can provide excellent care to individuals, families and the community, emphasising the ability to adapt, change and encouraging lifelong learning. Teachers therefore have a responsibility to guide the learning process and facilitate the acquisition of basic and professional skills by students, promoting their autonomy and critical thinking.

ESSLei's mission is to participate in the creation of opportunities based on the diversification of activities, both inside and outside the institution. To achieve this, teachers integrate their practical and academic activities, enabling students to interact with users and contexts both inside and outside the classroom.

The practising teacher can easily link curriculum knowledge to their own clinical experience and his role is not simply to transmit information or knowledge, but to present it in the form of problems to be solved.



in this course, teaching methods are not limited to the presentation of content, but also include active student participation, discussion and the application of knowledge to concrete situations and problems.

The design of this unique and privileged classroom space implies making it a multiple space for learning the specific content of the curricular unit and the profession of occupational therapy itself, where the teacher, who remains in clinical practice, transmits the experience of the profession and gives meaning to his experiences, which are the basis of his performance as a teacher, the result of his history and his life experiences as a health professional, influencing the academic success of the students.

The OT-EuroMaster is offered by five partners: Amsterdam University of Applied Sciences, NL (AUAS), University of Brighton, UK (UoB), University of A Coruña, ESP (UDC), Karolinska Institute, SWE (KI) and Zurich University of Applied Sciences, CH (ZHAW). In the Netherlands the OT-EuroMaster is officially classified as a "Master of Science" ("WO Master" in Dutch). The programme's primary goals are to support the development of research capacity in occupational therapy, and to create a body of advanced occupation-based knowledge and skills and an international community to enable our graduates to contribute to an inclusive, healthy and sustainable society in Europe and beyond.

NEWS FROM KAUNO KOLEGIJA

Some activities that were happening in our department.

December 3rd was the International Day of Disabled People around the world, and in Kaunas this day was celebrated throughout the month of December. The Girstutis branch of the Kaunas Cultural Center, in cooperation with the team of teachers and students of the Rehabilitation Department of the Faculty of Medicine, held various activities for people with mobility, hearing and mental disabilities on December 7.



Participants explored their sensory integration capabilities by discovering the deep sensations in the sensory group sock "we are" and experienced connection with others through the interactions of the vestibular and tactile systems. The participants ended the event by playing bocce.



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Also, the best way to get to know a new place is to participate in its organized activities, so on January 12. High school students from Klaipėda Vydūnas Gymnasium arrived at the Faculty of Medicine.

Rehabilitation specialists, like workers in other health care fields, are looking for new, innovative and effective ways to train impaired functions, paying more and more attention to newly emerging technologies. During the meeting, the students were introduced to various innovative rehabilitation tools (E-Link, PowerBall, Neofect, etc.), which they could try by performing different virtual activities - games. The classes did not leave anyone indifferent, the students willingly assessed their functional capabilities and got involved in interactive activities.

High school students also had the opportunity to feel the sensations of their bodies during experiential activities. During the meeting, the students discovered that there are more than 5 senses and appreciated the functioning of the proprioceptive, tactile and balance senses. Visitors also tried a group sensory sock and various stimulating activities.

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MIX MAX MEX: AN INCLUSIVE MUSICAL THEATRE PERFORMANCE IN GREECE

The Occupational Therapy Department and the Communication and Digital Media Department of the University of Western Macedonia (UoWM), Greece, participated and supported the inclusive musical theatre performance, entitled "MIX MAX MEX", on December 2 and 3, 2023 (International Day of Persons with Disabilities), in Kozani. Students and professors volunteered to participate in both the preparation and the performance. The activity was supported by research from the OT dept investigating the impact on:

1) children's participation in the behavioural performance, on their daily lives

2) therapists' and families' participation on psychological resilience and life satisfaction and

3) community's (audience at the performance) perceptions on social transformation, inclusion and promotion of occupational justice.

The performance is co-funded by Greece and the European Union, through the Operational Programme "Western Macedonia" 2014-2020 and was part of the campaign "Vges apo to kadro/Step out of the frame".

The musical theatre performance is based on "The Story of Mix, Max and Mex" by Luis Sepulveda and was an initiative of:

As for the month of February, Angela Lumpert Palacios - as the Student Board Member - attended the biyearly ENOTHE in-person meeting. This time it was held in Porto (Portugal) and hosted by the Escola Superior Saúde Santa Maria. During these meetings Angela and other new additions to the ENOTHE board were able to further integrate themselves within said board through team-building activities,

specifically reaching her goal to facilitate effective communication between the ENOTHE and SPOT boards, and of course to ensure a collaborative perspective is taken between OT students and educators in the activities ENOTHE is currently involved in relation to the development of OT higher education.

Throughout these past few months, we have given several SPOT promo presentations for students, including at the annual OT conference at the University of Salford, for Austrian students, at the Euregio-Day at PXL Hasselt, at the Ergotherapieschule LVR Klinik Düren, at the University of Zuyd and at ESSA in Portugal.These engagements have been invaluable for SPOTeurope, serving as opportunities to expand our network. 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ENOTHE WEBINARS COMING UP!



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CALOHEE - TUNING PROJECT

It has been a privilege, a responsibility, and gratitude for ENOTHE to lead the Tuning project alongside the group of 15 expert educators and two European students who formed a Task Force to update the Tuning competencies of the profession across three cycles (Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctorate). This project had the support of the direction of the Tuning Academy of the University of Groningen, under the leadership of Dr. Robert Wagenaar and his team, and was endorsed by the European Commission.

Furthermore, we express our deepest gratitude to the ENOTHE community for their invaluable contributions. Without their active participation and dedication, these achievements would not have been possible.

Occupational Therapy joined this renewal alongside other Subject Areas such as Medicine, Business Administration, Information Technology, and International Relations, among others.


The final product is the result of the collaborative efforts of the ENOTHE Tuning Task Force during monthly online meetings, encounters with the Academy, and conferences that took place between May 2022 and December 2023. Several initiatives were carried out to engage academics, students, professionals, and researchers, facilitating broader consultation on the revised competencies. This included workshops and presentations at the two Annual ENOTHE Meetings and incorporating feedback from the academic community through a survey on graduate profiles and employability. Additionally, 14 external experts were consulted in two rounds of the Delphi study, and the results were verified through an open consultation shared with over 650 contacts.

Translations of the competencies into three languages are currently available: Spanish, French, and Portuguese. Soon, we expect translations in Dutch, Swedish, and German. Furthermore, it is necessary to highlight the following information:

The guidelines and reference points are the result of a long and intense collaboration that began in 2001, in conjunction with the early phases of the Bologna Process, and now includes 49 European countries. They are the result of a grassroots initiative driven by universities, called Tuning Educational Structures in Europe, or simply "Tuning," which aims to offer a universally useful approach to the modernization of higher education at the institutional and subject area levels. The Tuning initiative has developed a methodology for (re)designing, developing, implementing, and evaluating educational programs for each of the Bologna cycles. These were validated in 2007-2008 by groups of respected academics from numerous disciplines. Since then, evolution has continued and has been reflected in several iterations, the latest of which is the Measurement and Comparison of Learning Outcomes in European Higher Education (CALOHEE) project and its extension (2018-2023).

The Tuning 2024 Guidelines and Reference Points for the Design and Delivery of Programs in Occupational Therapy serve as international reference points for this Subject Area within the European Higher Education Area (EHEA). This publication defines the profiles of the degrees and outlines the tasks and social functions of the graduates. It also shows how the different degrees are integrated into the broader context of general and specific qualification frameworks for each subject or discipline. In other words, what are the essential elements that constitute higher education in occupational therapy? Among other aspects, these guidelines include general descriptors for the first, second, and third cycles (Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctorate). They are presented in easily readable tables and are intended to serve as reference points for the design and delivery of various degree programs. Following the Tuning philosophy, each degree has its profile, based on the institution's mission and considering its sociocultural environment, its students, and the strengths of its academic staff.



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












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
